What is IEA? For student equestrians in grades 4-12, the Interscholastic Equestrian Association (IEA) introduces students to equestrian sports and offers an opportunity to learn and compete on a team. The unique aspect of IEA competitions is that none of the riders supply their own horses or tack. Instead, the host team arranges for the horses and equipment. Riders draw the name of the horse they will ride and are not allowed to school the horse before showing. Since the horse is new to the rider, the scores are based upon horsemanship and equitation. The competition season starts August 1st and ends at the National Finals in late spring / early summer. We have an extremely active and successful team, Capital City Equestrian, which is led by head coach Lindsey Mortimer and assistant coach Kylie Wiggins.
